# **International Motorcycle Symposium 2009**

In Europe, a motorcyclist's risk to be killed in a road accident is eighteen times that of a car driver. Motorcyclists account for 16 % of all deaths on the road although they make up only 2 % of all road users.

No matter where you go in Europe, the problem is the same. Everywhere 'non-motorbike-friendly' roads aggravate accidents. The possibilities to improve the active and passive safety of powered two-wheelers are equally limited everywhere. And everywhere there are both experienced and inexperienced bikers, young ones and older ones, responsible ones and those who will never learn.

The issues arising from this are manifold. What are the contributions that road construction, vehicle engineering, politics, legislation, administration, road safety education and training can and must deliver to cut the number of accidents involving motorcyclists?

To address this issue, the German Insurers Accident Research (UDV) and the German Road Safety Council have decided to join forces and conduct this international Motorcycle Symposium. We want to find out where there are problems in Europe and where there are smart solutions. We want to discuss how one country can benefit from good practice in others, and consider which of the problems can only be remedied at a national level and which ones should be tackled internationally.

What could be the next steps to improve motorcycle safety and what can all of us contribute?

Our objective at this symposium is to find answers and formulate a number of specific recommendations.

In this spirit, we are looking forward to your input and to an inspiring discussion.

# From Hauptbahnhof and from the other major railway stations, Lichtenberg and Ostbahnhof:


