ABOUT THE SYMPOSIUM

Every 4 years PIARC organizes an international symposium on pavement surface characteristics for roads and airfields, so called SURF events. The first symposium was held at State College, Pennsylvania, USA in June 1988, followed by symposia in Germany (Berlin, June 1992), New Zealand (Christchurch, September 1996), France (Nantes, June 2000), and Canada (Toronto, June 2004). The success and interest shown in these symposia has encouraged PIARC Technical Committee TC 4.2 "Road/Vehicle Interaction" and the Slovenian PIARC National Committee to organize the 6th International Symposium on Pavement Surface Characteristics of Roads and Airfields in 2008. SURF 2008 will be held in Slovenia.

TOPICS

The main objective of the Symposium is to share and discuss experience about how to improve quality through effective management of road infrastructure assets, in accordance with user expectations and managers' requests.

Technical sessions will include:
