Austroads will be coordinating a significant delegation from Australia and New Zealand to the World Road Congress. There will be strong involvement of representatives on technical committees. A contribution from both Australia and New Zealand will be made to the historical exhibition. New Zealand is contributing two national reports. Australia is organising a special sessions on freight vehicles. It is also anticipated that Australasia will participate in the national committees section of the Congress.
