## Welcome to Pretoria

**Pretoria** is a city in the northern part of Gauteng Province, South Africa. It is one of the country's three capital cities, serving as the executive (administrative) and de facto national capital; the others are Cape Town, the legislative capital, and Bloemfontein, the judicial capital. Pretoria is sometimes regarded as being divided into three sections: west, east and north, relative to the central business district. Pretoria is contained within the City of Tshwane Metropolitan Municipality as one of several constituent former administrations (among which also Centurion and Soshanguve). Pretoria itself is sometimes referred to as "Tshwane". Pretoria is named after the Voortrekker leader Andries Pretorius.

Pretoria in South Africa is popularly known as the Jacaranda City due to the thousands of Jacaranda trees planted in its streets, parks and gardens.

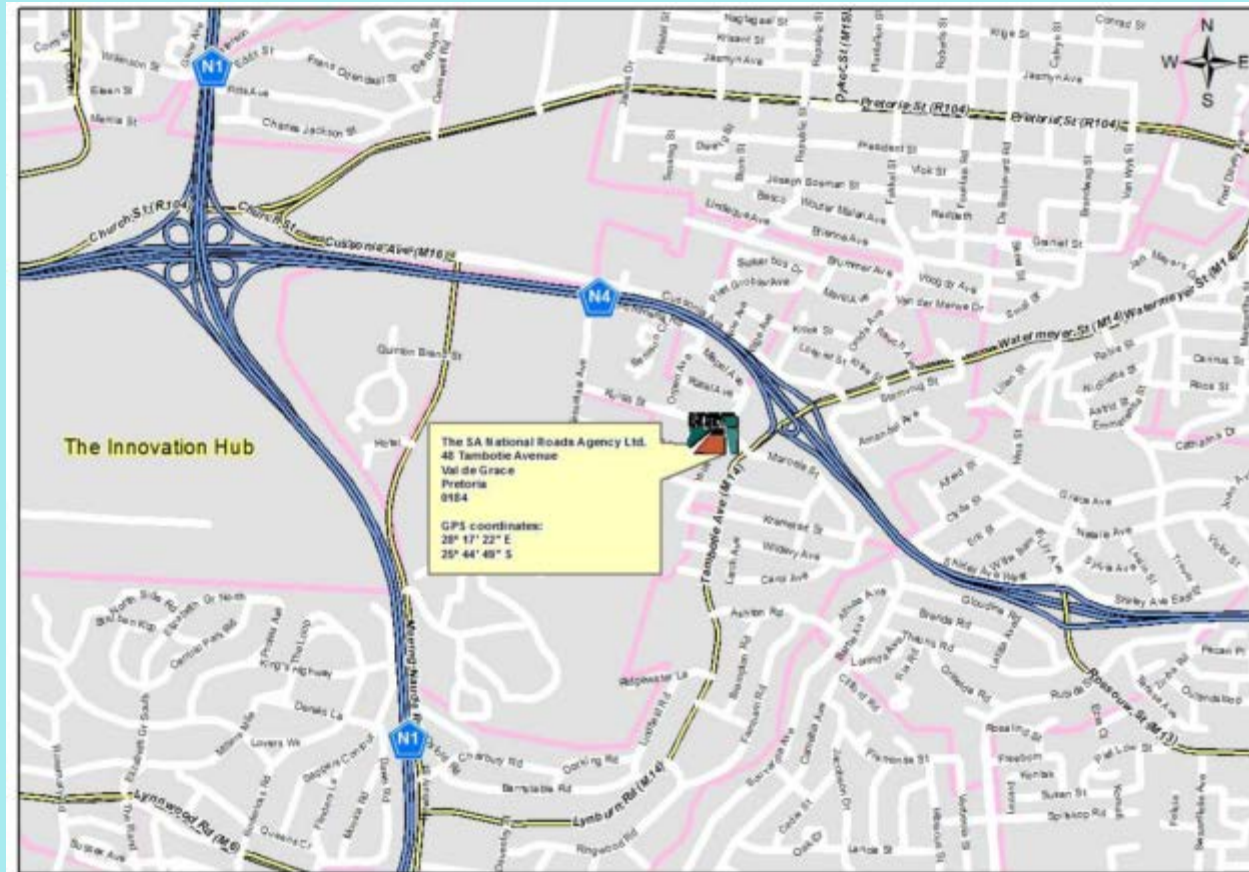


## SANRAL Overview

- The South African National Roads Agency SOC Limited, generally known as SANRAL, is an independent, statutory, state owned company registered in terms of the South African Companies Act. The South African government, represented by the Minister of Transport, is the sole shareholder and owner of SANRAL.
- SANRAL is responsible for management including maintenance, upgrades, funding and administration of South Africa's national road network (highways and freeways), which is currently 21,403km long.
- SANRAL is committed to carry out its mandate by protecting and preserving the environment through context-sensitive solutions.

## **HOTEL OPTIONS:**

**City Lodge – Lynnwood** R1072.62 excluding R115.00 for breakfast

About 3 kilometres from the venue – set in an area among interesting shops and restaurants



**This is the one we recommend**

**Town Lodge Menlyn** R 790.83 excluding R115.00 for breakfast

About 10 kilometres away from the venue (and you would need a cab to get to a mall)



**Falling Feather Bed & Breakfast** R 690.00 (this is walking distance from the venue)

You would require a cab to get to any shops or restaurants



**Hotel Sheraton Pretoria** – R1150 including breakfast

In the middle of CBD – very good hotel, but venue not great and you would need a cab to get to anywhere
