## **BACKGROUND**

This Seminar inserts itself in the PIARC Programme of International Seminars. The overall objective of the Programme is to ensure that the road and road transport related needs of all PIARC member countries are widely recognised so that outstanding issues and problems can be addressed and tackled. Progress may be achieved through the exchange of experiences, the transfer of technology, the work programmes of technical committees and the identification of research needed to fill the remaining gaps in knowledge. The Programme is designed to study a wide range of road related issues and problems of particular concern to developing and emerging nations.

The Seminar is organised by PIARC Technical Committee on Road/vehicle Interaction (C42). C42 has sixty-eight members from thirty-eight countries from all continents. Their knowledge and expertise are exchanged and disseminated worldwide through publications, participation in and organisation of international conferences and by organising comparisons between practices in the different countries and regions of the world.

The overall objective of this Seminar is to give developing and emerging nations (whether member or not of PIARC) the possibility to discuss and exchange their needs and requirements of surface characteristics for their road network with the knowledge of the international expertise within C42. The aim of the seminar is also to promote the initiation or improvement of co-operation between these nations and C42.

The Seminar is open to the road community worldwide. However, the seminar will address the needs of the countries belonging to the region surrounding the location of the seminar with similar climatic, geographical and socio-economic conditions. Regional road engineers and managers are therefore strongly encouraged to grasp this opportunity to express their views by offering a contribution to the seminar and/or actively taking part in the discussions.

## VENUE

**Hotel SOFITEL L'AMITIÉ\*\*\*\*\*** is located on the bank of river Niger in the business centre of Bamako. From the hotel, it takes a short stroll to visit the “Artisanat” (Handicraft), the “Marché Rose” (Pink Market) and the National Museum where professionals will let you discover the millennial history of great empires that existed in the Niger valley, the lifestyle of populations and the various cultures that shaped the country. Some attractions are renown outside Africa like the mosques of Djenné, Sankoré, Djinguirayeber, Tombouctou the “city of 333 saints” and the tomb of the Askias in Gao. There are less known though very interesting sites around Bamako like the rupestral paintings in Koulouba, the “Case Sacrée” (holy hut) in Kangaba, etc.

## REGISTRATION

The registration fee is 200 USD for delegates from countries with GNP > 2935 USD per capita, 120 USD for delegates from countries with GNP < 2935 USD per capita and 50 USD for accompanying persons. Registration forms will be included in a second announcement.
