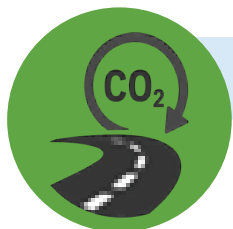

Congress Theme & Strategic Focus



Cross-Cutting Theme: Decarbonization

Decarbonization is a priority that spans all aspects of the road sector. PIARC's work examines both the reduction of emissions from road transport and the carbon footprint associated with the construction, operation, and maintenance of road infrastructure. Key areas of focus include low-carbon materials, sustainable construction practices, zero-emission vehicles, charging infrastructure, and policies that support the transition to a more sustainable transportation future.

Road administrations are facing growing pressure to deliver safe, reliable, and resilient transportation networks while managing limited resources and increasing public expectations. 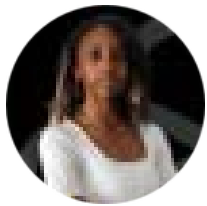

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Getting to Vancouver

As one of North America's premier international gateway cities, Vancouver is easily accessible from major destinations around the world. Positioned on Canada's Pacific Coast, the city serves as a strategic connection point between Asia, Europe, Oceania, the Middle East, and the Americas, making it an ideal host destination for a truly global congress.

Vancouver International Airport (YVR), consistently ranked among the world's leading airports, offers extensive non-stop and connecting service through major international and domestic carriers.

Located approximately 30 minutes from downtown Vancouver and the Vancouver Convention Centre, YVR provides delegates with efficient access to the city through rapid transit, taxis, rideshare services, and public transportation. Vancouver's compact downtown core further allows visitors to move easily between hotels, restaurants, attractions, and the Congress venue.
